Adoption of a Development Plan Document

West of England Joint Waste Core Strategy Development Plan Document

The four unitary authorities of Bath and North East Somerset Council, Bristol City Council, North Somerset Council and South Gloucestershire Council resolved to adopt the Joint Waste Core Strategy (JWCS) Development Plan Document (DPD) on **25 March 2011**.

The Joint Waste Core Strategy sets out the spatial planning policy framework to 2026 for sustainable waste management in the four authority areas. This DPD forms part of the Development Plan for each Authority.

A Statement of Sustainability and Consultation is available as an annex to this notice and provides information regarding how the Sustainability Appraisal, consultation and the consideration of alternatives have been taken into account in the adopted Joint waste Core Strategy.

Any person aggrieved by the Joint Waste Core Strategy DPD may make an application to the High Court under section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power or that a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Applications must be made within six weeks following the date of adoption of this DPD, and must be received therefore by no later than 6th May 2011.
